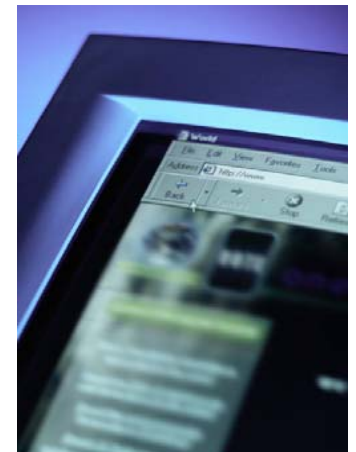

About the Web 2.0 Challenge

The Web 2.0 Challenge — a free, comprehensive, and interactive online course — will use hands-on exercises to introduce law librarians to many kinds of social technologies in just a few hours per week for five weeks.

The course will cover the following:

The course runs from July 21 to August 18, 2008 immediately following the AALL Annual Meeting.

Course Structure

Weekly activities will include an instructional screencast and hands-on exercises. Participants will blog about their experiences and discuss the technologies in a weekly small group chat session. At the end of the course, participants will develop proposals for implementing a specific Web 2.0 tool in their libraries.

Enrolled participants who complete all weekly activities will be eligible for weekly prize drawings, as well as a grand prize - an *iPod Touch*. Certificates will also be awarded to all participants who complete the course. All prizes are provided by CS-SIS.



Registration

Enrollment will be limited to 100 participants. If interest in this course is high, please be aware that not everyone who applies may be enrolled. Enrollment decisions will be based on commitment to completing the course requirements, availability for small group activities, and date of application.

Course content will be freely viewable to anyone who wishes to follow along. Only enrolled participants, however, will be assigned to small groups, be eligible for prizes, and receive a certification of completion.
